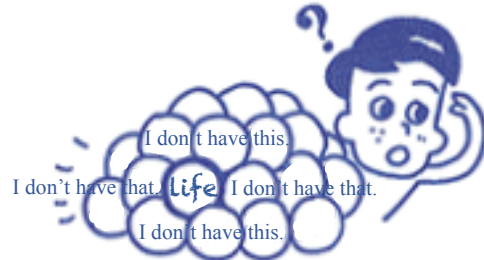


We All “Have” Life, Which Has Lasted 3.5 Billion Years



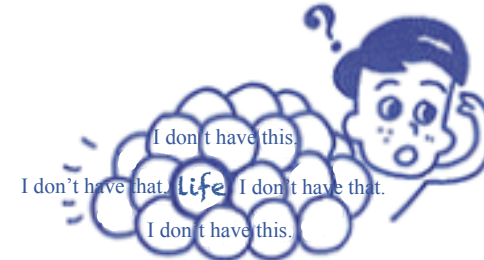
“I don’t have that. I don’t have this.” If we start looking for something we don’t have, we will end up being unable to see what we do have.
